Duluth surprises Fort Frances in OT

FORT FRANCES, Ont. –Julius Tamasy’s goal with 13 seconds remaining in overtime propelled the visiting Duluth Clydesdales to a 5-4 victory over the host Fort Frances Lakers Monday in Superior International Junior Hockey League action at Ice For Kids Arena.

Duluth would jump out to a two-goal first period lead on markers by Chris Palm and Joe Nelson before Matthew Caulfield made it 2-1 after 20

minutes.

Dane Morin would then beat Laker's netminder Jameson Shortreed 46 seconds into the middle frame to put the Clydesdales up a pair.

Fort Frances would answer back with two tallies to level the score at 3-3 before the stanza was complete as Jace Baldwin and Morgan McNeill struck five minutes apart.

The Lakers would take the lead midway through the third as Henry Gutierrez fired his ninth of the campaign past Jeff Dunaisky in the Duluth net.

Clydesdales co-captain Tom Paine would answer right back less than a minute later forcing extra time where Tamasy would bury the game-winner for his first goal in a Duluth uniform after being acquired in a recent deal with Dryden.

Dunaisky would make 33 saves to pick-up the win while Shortreed had 25 stops in the OT setback.

The victory snaps a six-game losing streak for Duluth while the Lakers, despite earning a point, saw their winless slump extend to three contests.
